#### **Parent Survey**

I have been sharing the results of the recent part survey during the 'Meet and Greet' sessions. The areas of positivity were:

- Parents / carers felt children were safe and happy
- Parents / carers felt children were well taught
- Parents / carers felt children made good progress at school
- Parents / carers would recommend this school to another family

The area for improvement were:

- Leadership and management
- Communication
- Academic challenge including homework

To address some of the areas for improvement we will be implementing a full schedule of parents' evenings next academic year and will hold Open Afternoons for all year groups before the Summer Holidays. Further Open Forum sessions with the Head Teacher and other relevant staff will be implemented from September. Keep an eye out in the newsletter for these sessions.

Learning at Home will begin in the second week of term and all learning will be a consolidation of learning that has happened in the classroom. There will be a short newsletter next week and I hope that you have a great weekend and manage to enjoy some more of the great weather we are having.



### Predicted Extreme Heat Weather Warnings

The Met Office has extended an <u>amber extreme heat warning</u> for Sunday 17 July, Monday 18 July and Tuesday 19 July, as temperatures will build this weekend and early next week for much of England and Wales.

The amber warning highlights likely adverse health effects for the public, not just limited to those most vulnerable to extreme heat.

Temperatures could be in excess of 35°C in the southeast, and more widely around 32°C within the <u>warning area</u>, with Monday and Tuesday most likely to see temperatures around this level.

There is clear government guidance on <u>looking after children and those in early</u> <u>years settings during heatwaves</u>, including the use of ventilation, keeping children hydrated, and avoiding vigorous physical activity, encouraging children to wear loose, light coloured clothing and sunhats with wide brims, to use sunscreen, and providing them with plenty of water.

Individual school leaders are responsible for managing their own local circumstances. We are not advising schools to close.

#### Acorn

Acorn class are still thoroughly enjoying their learning about under the sea!

We have now completed our class display. We created coral reef, jellyfish, fish and starfish all on our own, using the skills Miss Simmonds has taught us (folding, cutting, printing, collage).

We have used the information book 'The Big Book of the Blue' to help us learn facts about the animals that live under the sea. We then wrote our own factual sentences about under the sea creatures. In Maths, we have been looking at odd and even numbers and have been sharing into groups. We have learned that halving is when you are fair and

share into 2 groups. During busy time, we have chosen to create our own treasure chests and telescopes. We have continued to enjoy our time in the Wild World. We have been collecting minibeasts, building dens and playing in the mud kitchen. This week, we also enjoyed our first Sports Day and had an afternoon of activities in our new Year 1 classroom.

### Birch

Birch Class have been very busy! Last week, we had Willow for part of the week. In English, he helped us to write letters to our new teachers. He also helped us test which magnets were the strongest in Science. In Computing, we learnt more about simulations and we explored what would happen when we clicked on different solutions. We also finished our unit on fractions and are going to recap time this week. We are also writing instructions on how to make a healthy sandwich and we will be learning how to sew in Art.

In Ash class, we have listening to the story 'The Secret Sky Garden'. We have been writing descriptive sentences about the main character. This week we have created our own main character, ready to write our own story. In Maths, we have been working hard to recognise money. We have learnt all about the coins and the notes and have been showing determination when counting amounts of money. Our adults have been impressed with our money skills! In Geography we have been learning about Gloucester and London. We have shown great teamwork to create posters about both cities. We enjoyed our author visit from Andy Seed and asked lots of great questions.

In Elm class, we have started writing instruction texts based on, 'The Legend of Podkin One-Ear'. The children are using their maps to write instructions on how Podkin can escape the Gorm and find safety. They have some very exciting ideas! In Maths, we have been converting between units of measurements. For example, what is 34.8m in centimetres? Elm class loved spending time with Andy Seed on Friday. Some of the children were able to go up and read to the audience with Andy Seed. Andy Seed taught the children a fun alphabet game which we played in class. Elm class wore clothes to swimming this week to learn how to swim in an emergency. They were very sensible and were still able to swim very well! We love watching the children's skills progress. The children have also started decorating their cushions inspired by Robert and Sonia Delaunay. We can't wait to show you the finished products next week!



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The Summer Reading Challenge is the UK's biggest **free** reading for pleasure programme for children.

The Challenge encourages children aged 4 to 11 to keep reading during the summer holidays.

At the heart of the Summer Reading Challenge is a child's ability to shape their reading journey. Help us to spread the word that reading for pleasure is free and fun!

The Summer Reading Challenge combines **FREE** access to books with fun, creative activities during the summer holidays. Throughout the Challenge, library staff support the children, helping them to discover new authors and illustrators and to explore a wide range of different types of books and ways of reading.

### How the Challenge works

- The Reading Challenge starts Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> July and runs till 12<sup>th</sup> September
- Children sign up through their local library and receive a Gadgeteers collector poster.
  If your child isn't a library member it is free and easy to join.
- Children need to visit the library 3 times and borrow at least 2 books each visit these can be fiction, non-fiction or audio and e books.
- On each visit there are a series of stickers to collect with a certificate and medal on the 3<sup>rd</sup> visit.
  - The challenge is open to school age children and children starting school in September.
