We have had wonderful start to 2023! We have started our new topic, 'Ready, Steady Grow', where we are learning about the farm and where food comes from. The children have been enjoying playing the small world farmyard and have been helping to make our farm display with their art work.

In Maths, we have been learning about numbers 6, 7 and 8 and we are just about to start some adding for the first time!

Ash

Ash class have had an exciting first few weeks of school.

We returned to find a spaceship had crashed into the classroom belonging to a mysterious alien called Beegu. We have explored Beegu's story and have been using our knowledge of adjectives to describe our character.

We have also started our learning about 'Seasonal Changes'. The children have been predicting what they believe will happen as Winter turns into Spring. We can't wait to see if we were correct!

Birch class have had an amazing start to the new term. In English we have started a new story called 'Ocean Meets Sky.' We have written a character description, a setting description and next week we will be writing our own version of the story,

In Maths, we have been impressing our adults with our multiplication and division knowledge.

Our new project for this term is called Coastline. So far, we have learnt what a coastline is and how to use a compass for directions. We can't wait to learn more!

Chestnut

Chestnut class have had a brilliant start to the new year.

We have been exploring setting descriptions in English using the book 'Wolves' by Emily Gravett as our stimuli whilst in maths we have been comparing and ordering fractions.

The earth is the focus for geography this term, we have been learning about tectonic plates and longitude and latitude lines and we have been having loves of fun making composts containers in outdoor learning.



Elm

Elm class have been very busy this week learning about the twelve times table. The children have found this a little bit tricky but have been very determined in answering the questions.

In literacy we have been reading The Barnabus Project. The children have had the chance to create their own perfect pet and explore the use of similes and metaphors.

In ICT this week, the children loved designing their own animations.

The children had the opportunity to make their own circuits in science. They loved making lots of noise with the buzzers.

Maple

Maple Class have been very busy this week.

In Maths, we have been learning about prime numbers and squared numbers. Miss Powell has been very impressed!

We have also been reading our new class text - Hansel and Gretel. We will be using this as a basis to write own story over the next few weeks.

In Art, we have been learning about different types of shading using pencil, ink wash and biro. We experimented with smudging, stippling, cross-hatching and scribbling.

Oak class have had an amazing start to the new year. The class are showing exceptional progress in adding fractions in our maths lessons.

The children have enjoyed reading, 'The Mysteries of Harris Burdick' in our writing lessons. We are currently writing fiction stories based on one of the illustrations. They are enjoying writing a mysterious story.

In other lessons, we have enjoyed creating bridges, learning about daylight in the Arctic and Antarctic and setting new year's resolutions.
