#### Dear Parents / Carers

A huge welcome to the new families that have joined us recently. The growing number of children at Willow is testament to the hard work and dedication of the staff to provide the best possible education for your children.

### **Morning Drop Off**

During the morning drop off we would like to develop independence of children in Key Stage 2 and to prepare them for secondary school. I would like to remind parents that they can drop their child off at the first gate. This will also reduce the pedestrian traffic within the school playground at this busy time of the day. I would certainly encourage this for children in Year 5 and Year 6 as this would aid the transition to secondary school.

#### **Talking to Teachers**

During the morning drop off teachers are often at their classroom doors. The purpose of them being there is to welcome their class to school and make children feel comfortable and happy when they arrive. During this time, they are welcoming the children and learning begins immediately when children arrive and this is their main focus.

If you need to talk to a staff member initially, can you find a Senior Leader or a Family Welfare Officer who will be more than happy to help and pass any relevant information onto the appropriate staff. You can also communicate with your child's Class Teacher via Class Dojo. I will encourage teachers to check Class Dojo between 8.30 am and 8.40 am for any morning messages.

At the end of the school day, the teachers are more available to talk to parents and carers and therefore this is a better time to catch your child's teacher.

#### **NEU Strike**

You may have heard in the news that the National Education Union (NEU) has voted to strike on a number of days over the coming months, with the first planned day being Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> February, 2023.

Each school in SAND AT will be affected to differing degrees depending upon its union membership and each will need to react accordingly.

I am, therefore, writing to you to inform you that the normal school day in your child's school may well be disrupted on strike days. Depending upon the anticipated extent of the disruption each school will make their own arrangements, which may include partial or full closure of some classes.

We very much hope that this will not be necessary, however, our top priority remains as always, the health and safety of our pupils. In our planning, we will be following the department for Education's guidance to prioritise vulnerable children and the children of key workers.

Your child's school will write to you next week to give you further details on how it will be operating on the 1<sup>st</sup> February.


