On Thursday we had Clare come and scrutinise our maths curriculum. The main findings of the visit are as follows:

- Evidence in books, through learning walks and in discussion with pupils clearly shows that there is progression across the school.
- Evidence clearly in the progression of skills across the school, and in the work produced by the teachers for the pupils to complete. Leaders are confident in the way they talk about the intent, implementation and impact of the chosen maths curriculum.

My favourite quote from the report is as follows:

'The children were a real credit to the school and answered the questions accurately and with ease. They all knew what they were learning, why, how well they are doing, what they can do if they need help, and the older pupils knew what their next steps were.'

Acorn

This week, we have been learning about Chinese New Year or Lunar New Year. We have learned about the traditions and have used our creative skills to make a Chinese dragon that moves and lanterns!

In Maths, we have been learning how to combine two groups to make a whole – the start of addition!

We have also continued to learn about the farm and crops that grow there. We have carefully chopped up fruits to make a healthy fruit salad and have created portraits in the style of Arcimboldo.

What a busy time we've had!

Birch

We have had a very productive week in Birch class!

In Geography we have been learning about erosion and the effects it has. We did a demonstration using sand and water to help with our understanding. We used some great vocabulary.

In Maths, we have been learning about measuring the mass of objects. We have used scales to read the weights in kilograms and grams.

In Science we have been continuing our materials project. We conducted an experiment to see if materials could be changed by bending, twisting, stretching and squashing. It was a lot of fun and hard work!

Ash

This week in Ash Class, we have been starting our learning on Meerkats based on the book 'Meerkat Mail' to create a fact file. We have been researching facts that we would include and how we would create an effective fact file.

We were very lucky to have a visit from police officer Chloe who told us all about what the police do and how they keep us safe. We even got to try on police uniform. We really enjoyed this!

Our Maths has come along very well! We are experts at partitioning and using this information to help us complete addition and subtraction questions. To assist with our subtractions, we have mastered counting backwards from 20 to solve problems. We have been working very hard!

Chestnut

Chestnut class have been working super hard in Science this week. We have been investigating forces by using the Newton meters to pull objects within our classroom. We have also been reading the book 'The Tunnel' by Anthony Browne in English, thinking about the characters and how their feelings change throughout the book. Swimming this week was also so much fun!



Elm

Elm Class have been really enjoying their reading time. Many children have moved up to higher reading levels due to the amazing progress they are making. We are very proud!

In Guided reading sessions, children have been getting immersed in short stories with cliff-hangers and have enjoyed making predictions about what might happen next using evidence from the text.

In English, we have been reading The Barnabus Project and the children have been applying their knowledge of direct speech punctuation to write stories based on this book. We have been really impressed with the results.

Maple

Maple Class have continued to develop their understanding of long multiplication in Maths. We learnt what a bar was in Music and we have learnt about what makes a mammal a mammal is Science. We will be using our knowledge of mammals and their life cycles to write our own explanation text in English.

We also had a visit from a police officer who talked to use about anti-social behaviour.

Oak

We have been working extremely hard in Oak class. We have completed our second round of mock SATS. Miss Flynn is happy with the progress we are making in SPAG and spelling.

We met with a police officer this week. She talked to us about anti-social behaviour. We learned a lot from her, and we enjoyed asking her questions about her experience in the job.

In DT, we are finishing our engineering unit by writing a non-chronological report on bridges.




