We have been showing lots of determination to consider the best way to present our reports. In English, we are writing a story based on the lion and the mouse by Jerry Pinkney. The children have been trying really hard to order the story and learn the features of a narrative. The children continue to show lots of determination during swimming sessions and have loved making food webs during outdoor learning.

Maple Class have been reading 'Quest' by Aaron Becker. This is the sequel to the 'Journey' that we read in the Autumn term. We have enjoyed looking at the pictures and making inferences.

In Music, we have been creating and performing our own body percussion sequences.

We have also been learning about old age and how the body declines in Science. Willow loved helping us with this lesson!

Elm class have started the unit of decimal places in maths this week. We are finding it a little tricky but showing our determination skills!

Our English unit has allowed us to create our own imaginary castles. This has been very fun and the children have shown their wonderful imaginations.

In DT, we have enjoyed exploring different ways of moving objects and creating our own pully systems. We are excited to create our own vehicles soon.

In Art, we have started the unit of Islamic Art. We have loved making our own motif and geometric patterns.

We have been very focused in Oak class this week. In English, we have produced balanced arguments based on whether people should be allowed to live forever?

In Maths, we have been calculating the area of parallelograms and triangles.

In Guided Reading, we have been performing a poem, 'Humpty Dumpty: The Truth'.


We also started our new science unit, 'Light Theory' - we reviewed what we have already learned about light in the past and what questions we still have. We are excited to begin our investigations!










STAR READER...
