### Pride News



#### Acorn

Acorn class have been enjoying their learning about minibeasts this week. We started our learning off by going on a minibeast safari in the Wild World. We found so many different types of bugs! We have learned about insects having 6 legs and 3 body parts and have created our own pictures of 'The Snail', inspired by the artist Matisse.

In Maths, we have been becoming more familiar with how to make 5 and 10 in lots of different ways!

We have started whole class reading sessions, which we are really enjoying! Last week, we read 'The Enormous Turnip' and focused on new vocabulary and answering retrieval questions. This week, we have been sequencing the story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'.

#### Birch

Last week we went on our trip to St Barnabas Church to learn all about the Easter story. We were very well behaved and enjoyed our sunny walk there and back. Inside we visited 5 different stations that taught us about different parts of the Easter story. Our favourite stations were the 'last supper' and the 'Garden of Gethsemane'. We thoroughly enjoyed decorating stones to show things that make us happy. Back in the classroom, we have been working hard in our writing lessons. We are learning to write a non-chronological report about Captain James Cook. If you see any of us, ask us a fact about him! In science, we have amazed our adults with our science knowledge and today we wrote fact files about plants and what they need to grow.

#### Ash

In Ash Class, we have made London Taxis based on our learning in our main topic and our knowledge of axles, wheels and chassis. The children did an amazing job and even got to use the saw for our axles!

Throughout the week, we have been learning about the Easter Story and been doing Easter based activities in provision. The children have been getting very creative with their making and writing about the story and things we associate with Easter.

To conclude our learning about Seasonal Change, the children have been spotting signs of Spring and we have been comparing this to what we remember from Winter. Our lovey sunny day on Monday was a large topic of conversation and the children compared this to when we had snow to use as arguments for why they believe it is now Spring.

Chestnut

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On Monday, Chestnut class demonstrated lots of courage by standing up in front of the rest of the school and their parents to talk about what they have been learning this year. The adults were super proud of them.

In maths we are showing lots of determination to understand how to subtract money and showing our skills in giving the correct change.

We have also been showing lots of focus in English this week as we have been preparing to write our own independent newspaper reports based on 'The lion and the mouse' by Jerry Pinkney.



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#### Maple

Maple Class have had another busy week. We have been continuing our work on converting measurements in Maths. Miss Powell was very impressed with our work!

In Geography, we have been learning about food miles and the journey that our food goes on before it reaches us. Finally, in PSHE, we have been learning about body image and how to be positive.

What a fantastic week we've had to end this term! We completed our final mock
SATS this week. Lots of Oak class are
showing good progress and are on track
to pass their SATS in May.

Oak

We had fun creating 'Timmy the turtle' out of recycled materials to raise awareness of plastic pollution in our oceans. We also enjoyed a trip to the library to take out some new books to read over the Easter holidays.

#### Elm

Elm Class have really enjoyed using the film 'Tadeo Jones' to write a setting description and diary entry this week. We were really impressed by the vocabulary the children were using in both.

In Music, the children have been composing their own music based on Beethoven's Symphony No. 5. They have been using fast and slow rhythms and contrasting motifs.

The children have been creating classification keys in Science and will be continuing to create these to identify animals after Easter.


### PRIDE Champions




#### HALF TERM READING CHALLENGE!
