

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# **Reading Rocks**



This term, we have introduced 'Reading Rocks' assemblies, where children in Early Years and Key Stage One have been hearing stories written by Oliver Jeffers and Key Stage Two have heard extracts of text by Malorie Blackman. These assemblies are introducing our children to a range of different authors.

Our authors of the term for our final term this year are: Nick Sharratt (EYFS/KS1) and Cressida Cowell (KS2).





We have also decided that reading is so amazing, that we are now calling our whole class reading lessons, 'Reading Rocks' lessons! We have recently purchased a new teaching resource which is introducing each class to three extracts from three different texts a week. So far, the children are loving having a range of extracts, they are enjoying the amount of discussion we are having about the texts and some of the pupils have already asked if we can buy the real book for their class library! Reading really does ROCK!
