Dear Parents and Carers

#### Acorn

The children in Acorn class loved their trip to Robinswood Hill last week! They found lots of different minibeasts in different habitats, including snails, worms, tadpoles and newts!

In Maths, we have been learning how to add and take away and have started to write number sentences to show the 'story' of what is happening.

This week, the children have started working with a grown-up to write sentences in a brand new learning journey book! This is to help us get ready for Year 1! There have been some amazing sentences about our trip. We even showed them to Mr Hales!

We have started our topic, 'Big Wide World' and have been enjoying stories about different cutures.

#### Birch

In Birch class, we have been enjoying our new history project called Magnificent Monarchs. Last week we learnt lot of new vocabulary. We applied this vocabulary to today's lesson where we created a timeline of the monarchs we have had since Anglo-Saxon times to now! We are very excited about this project and the coronation of the King!

In maths, we have been impressing our adults with our knowledge of statistics. We have been interpreting tables, drawing tally charts and pictograms! In English, we have been writing a setting description about the pond from our story Tad. We have been using some great adjectives to describe! As

In Ash class, we have been getting stuck into our new class story 'Pumpkin Soup'. We have been writing instructions on how to make pumpkin soup and have now moved onto using out knowledge of adjectives to improve our writing and grab our readers attention. The children created persuasive posters to encourage people to go to 'Duck's Soup Stand' and independently used a range of vocabulary. We have also been learning about position and direction in Maths. The children have been learning whole, half, guarter and three-quarter turns, including the skill of knowing their left and right. This has been tricky as there is so many new skills and a lot of new vocabulary to learn but the children have been so determined to master this skill.

#### Chestnut

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Chesnut class have had an exciting start to the term,. We have been set a surprise mission to travel around the world just like Nellie Bly. To prepare us for this mission, we used props to create a world map. The children worked extremely well together and used their imagination to consider what each of the resources could represent. We cannot wait for our next mission.

In maths we have been finding fractions of amounts whilst in English we have been preparing to write our diary entries based on the story 'Jim and the Beanstalk' by Raymond Briggs



### Maple

Maple Class have had a busy week. We really enjoyed taking part in the coronation dance workshop. We have also been reading Tin Forest and writing a character and setting description as a well as a diary from the old man's point of view. In Maths, we have been learning about mixed number fractions, proper and improper fractions and adding them together.

Oak class have been learning how to work out the average/mean of a set of numbers in maths. We have been writing sport's commentary on high diving giraffes in English. We have been working very hard to prepare for our SATS which are coming up in just over a week!

Elm class have started working on fractions this week. We have found it a bit tricky but are showing our PRIDE value of determination! 

# **Pride News**

#### NEW HOME LEARNING INFORMATION

We are excited to let you know that we are now moving to an online home learning platform called **Doodle.** This will replace the use of homework books that we currently have in place. We feel this approach will better engage the pupils in their homework tasks, reduce the number of pupils misplacing their homework and better prepare them for the expectations when moving through Key Stage 2 and onto Secondary school.

All pupils have already logged onto the Doodle apps in school and have completed baseline assessments, so they are already familiar with the format and use of Doodle. They are always very excited to log in and complete the activities. We have included their individual log in details along with this letter so that they can now continue to log in and complete tasks at home. Using Doodle for just 10 minutes per day is proven to help children make more rapid progress.

As your child completes tasks, they earn stars. These stars will result in prizes back in school, so the more they earn, the more they win!

#### How to get started

1. Download all of the Doodle apps (DoodleMaths, DoodleTables, DoodleEnglish and DoodleSpell) onto an Apple, Android or Amazon device. You can also log in to the Doodle programmes through the website (doodlelearning.com) on laptops and desktops by clicking 'log in' and choosing a programme.

2. Use the username and password provided by your child's teacher to log in. You can use the same login details to access all four Doodle programmes.

 If you wish to view your child's progress then you will need to link your email address to your child's account by logging in, tapping on the arrow icon in the top left-hand corner and selecting Settings > Parent details. Or, visit parents.doodlelearning.com and head to Manage > Subscriptions.

 You'll then be able to view your child's progress by visiting parents.doodlelearning.com or downloading the free DoodleConnect app on Apple and Android devices.

Every Friday, teachers will provide an additional homework task linking to the broader curriculum on Class Dojo. The expectations and deadlines for these will be set by the teacher, so please keep an eye out for these each week.

If you have any questions about this then please ask your child's class teacher.
