

#### Headteacher's Message...

Dear Parents / Carers

We have certainly been blessed with some sunshine this week. It has been very hot in school!

It has been great to see children being able to go out of the school and demonstrate the PRIDE Values during the visits.

#### **Ash Class**

Ash Class did Willow proud at the Victorian classroom. They were very respectful and engaged in everything throughout the session. They got to dress up like a Victorian child, use real slate boards and slate pens to write their names and a sentence, and some children even tried some of the punishments like the back straightener and the finger stocks.

#### **Oak Class**

Today Oak Class have been to the MAD Museum and the Butterfly Farm. At the MAD Museum they will have been looking at the different forms of Mechanical Art and Design.

#### **Careers Week**

Excitement is building for our Careers Week which begins on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> July. There are lots of exciting events planned for this week including trips on train, a visit to Dinky Street or a visit to Kidzania. Your child should have brought a letter home regarding the trips that they are going on. A voluntary contribution would be appreciated.

#### Acorn

This week, we have been learning the story 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'. We have listened to the story (thinking about what happens at the beginning, middle and end), have retold the story using a story map and actions, have acted the story out with our friends, have drawn our own story maps and have written a caption to match a picture in our writing books!

In Maths, we have been thinking about all of the ways we can make the numbers 6, 7, 8 and

9. We have also thought about what is one more/one less than these numbers and if they are odd or even.

It has been so hot this week, so the children have learned how to make their own fans to help them cool down! They even made some for the grown ups!

#### Birch

In English, we have been learning about newspaper reports. We are excited to write our own about spotting the giant from our story Grandad's Secret Giant.

In Music, we have been learning a new song. It is all about home. We worked in groups to think about the sounds we hear at home. We learnt what a conductor was and then took it turns to be a conductor for our groups.

In Science we have been continuing our animal survival project. This week we have learnt what offspring is. We worked in our table groups to match the offspring to its parent. Then we grouped them into their animal groups. We had some great discussions about what we \_\_\_\_\_\_\_noticed in each group! \_\_\_\_\_\_

#### Ash

This week, Ash class went on a trip to the Dean Heritage Centre. We went back in time to the Victorian era and attended school. We started by paying our teacher and arranging ourselves in the classroom, boys and the front and girls at the back. The children used real slate board and slate pens to write their name and a sentence. Some children got to experience some of the punishments like the back straightener and the finger stocks. The teacher also demonstrated how teachers would use the cane... this was shown on a pillow not on any of our children luckily!

#### Chestnut

In English this week, we have begun our unit based on the story 'Arthur and the golden rope'. We have been thinking about unlikely heroes and writing a character description on what we think they look like.

In maths, we have been learning about measurement, with a focus on mass this week, where we have been comparing and ordering.

In History, we have been learning about the Roman army including understanding the hierarchy and the roles of the soldiers.



## Maple

This week, Maple Class have started a new text in English – The Tempest. We have enjoyed writing character descriptions focusing on starting sentences in different ways.

In Maths, we have been consolidating our learning on acute, obtuse and right angles.. We have also learnt about reflex angles.

In Science, we have continued our learning on seperating mixtures. This week, we experimented using filter paper to separate different sand and water, stones and water and soil and water.

#### Elm

This week Elm Class have been creating their own printing designs based on the work of William Morris in DT. They are going to be designing their own wall hanging using these techniques next week. The children really enjoyed the Commando Joe's session this week, where they had to design a new city. Children were really imaginative when using the equipment and some of them thought carefully about how to defend their cities. The adults want to say a massive well done to Elm Class for completing their multiplication tables check in very mature manner. They were focused and determined, and all pupils tried their best.

#### Oak

This week, Oak class wrote a setting description based on the novel, 'Dracula'. The children were challenged to use personification and pathetic fallacy in their work. We have been consolidating our learning of fractions in maths.

We had an interesting discussion about pregnancy in PSHE and what a baby can and cannot do in the womb. We have been learning about inheritance and genes in science; we enjoyed collecting data within our class based on physical traits that can be inherited.

We are ending our week with a very exciting trip to the MAD museum and the butterfly farm! We can't wait to tell you all about this next week.










STAR READER...
