Reading at Home



We will also now have a Remarkable Reader for progress, but there will also be a winner for the person who has read the most at home!

In order for your child to become a skilled, fluent reader, they need to be reading regularly. The more they can read accurately and automatically (without having to stop to sound out), the more they will be able to understand (comprehend) what is happening.

We are therefore encouraging our pupils to read as much as they can at home and record it in their reading diaries. Diaries will be checked once a week by the class teacher and children will be given a Dojo Point for the number of times they have read.

Please make sure reading diaries are in school **EVERY DAY!**
