Spotlight on the Curriculum



Spotlight on the Curriculum Reading Review:



"Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment every day not only perform better in reading tests than those who don't, but also develop a broader vocabulary, increased general knowledge and a better understanding of other cultures. Infact, reading for pleasure is more

likely to determine whether a child does well at school than their social or economic background." (Pearson 2021)

During the last week we had a visit from a School Improvement Partner and a Reading Lead from another local mainstream primary. The highlights of the report are as follows:

How do we achieve this?

The subject leader for reading is clearly aspirational for pupils to become fluent readers and to develop a 'lifelong love of reading'

Teachers make good use of the interactive whiteboards that provide clarity about the purpose of the lesson.

Adults confidently demonstrated their skill at supporting individual pupils to engage and learn basic phonic knowledge successfully.

To achieve the school's objectives, leaders have provided relevant training opportunities to staff to develop their subject knowledge and to strengthen their expertise in teaching reading.

Teachers often challenged pupils to extend their vocabulary by asking focused questions to gauge their knowledge and understanding.

Most pupils demonstrated good learning attitudes, which were evident in that they listened carefully, paid attention and responded positively when asked to answer questions.

- Make conversations about mental health a normal part of life
- Give it your full attention be an active listener
- Take it seriously and explore the feelings together
