#### **Swimming**



Swimming is going to take place at Willow Primary Academy this year! Due to the closure of the main swimming provider in the city (GL1) we have had to seek alternative arrangements. We have an undercover pop-up pool arriving in November. The children in years 2-6 will swim daily from  $13^{th}$  November  $-24^{th}$  November. The children in these year groups will swim for 30 minutes a day. The pool is heated and under a shelter so swimming will take place no matter the weather. The children will be taught to swim by a qualified swimming teacher and there will also be a qualified lifeguard present for every session too.

#### Your child will need:

- Sliders or flip flops to walk from school to the pool.
- A dressing gown or oversized fleece to cover themselves as soon as they get out of the pool.
- A towel to dry themselves in.
- Swimming goggles if they wish
- A swimming hat is necessary for swimming in a pop-up pool. You may buy one before these sessions or borrow one from school.

Please look out for a separate letter, sign the consent form and return to school by Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> November 2023.

At Willow Primary Academy, we have a high percentage of SEN pupils. To support communication between home and school, we have recently invested in a new online system, EduKey. EduKey is a platform for parents and staff to upload key documents relating to your child's SEN, parents to make comments about their child's plans/provision and be informed of all updates as they occur. For parents of children with SEN, a copy of a sign up letter should have been given to you at parents evening. If you cannot access the system or require a new letter, please contact the class teacher or the SENCO, Mrs Griffin.

#### Safeguarding Safety Tip of the Week Physical Abuse

Keeping Children Safe in Education 2023 categorises four main types of abuse: these are physical, emotional, sexual and neglect. Physical abuse is when someone hurts or harms a child or young person on purpose. It can include hitting, shaking, throwing. Physical harm may also be caused when a parent fabricates or induces symptoms of illness in a child. Chastisement can also be classed as physical abuse when excessive force is used. # **Secondary School Applications Information for Year 6 Parents**

If your child is due to transfer from primary to secondary school in September 2024. Local authorities co-ordinate secondary transfer admissions for all maintained (non-fee paying) schools. This means parent/carers should apply to the local authority in which they live (the council to which they pay council tax).

If you live in Gloucestershire, you should apply for your child's secondary school place online at this <u>link</u> between 1 September and 31 October 2023.

It is important that you submit your application by 31 October 2023.

Applications received after the national closing date of 31 October 2023 will be treated as late applications. Late applicants are less likely to be offered a place at one of their preferred schools, as these applications will be processed after 1 March 2024, in accordance with Birmingham's coordinated admissions scheme.


