Spotlight on the Curriculum Art



At Willow Primary Academy, we have adopted the Cornerstones Curriculum to help us construct our Art curriculum. The Art curriculum is designed to progressively develop the children's skills and knowledge in Art from Reception through to Year 6. Children learn about a wife range of artists and gain artistic knowledge and vocabulary.

Opportunities are made for making meaningful connections with other subjects. For example, the project Dynamic Dynasties is taught alongside the art and design project Taotie to give children a better all-round understanding of ancient Chinese arts and culture.

What do we achieve this?

Years 1-6 are taught through driver projects.

Knowledge organisers have been introduced.

A wide range of resources are used such as clay, charcoal, watercolour paints, ink, cameras etc.

Opportunities to join in whole school and local art competitions.

Visits from artists to inspire children.

Focus on specific artists.

Safeguarding Safety Tip of the Week Emotional Abuse

This week our safeguarding focus is emotional abuse. Emotional abuse is any type of abuse that involves the continual emotional mistreatment of a child. It is sometimes called psychological abuse. Emotional abuse can involve deliberately trying to scare, humiliate, isolate or ignore a child. Other examples are: constantly criticising a child; blaming or scapegoating a child or exposing a child to upsetting events or situations. Because of the nature of emotional abuse, a child might not realise what is happening to them or might even blame themselves. For more information visit:


