
first week with 94.63% attendance!



We all believe that P.E is very important here at Willow. This lesson helps us to develop our communication skills, build our stamina and resilience, help us work well as a team as well as making you healthier and happier both physically and mentally. Reception class build upon their physical development multiple times a day using their two outdoor areas. Through their continuous provision children have the opportunities to crawl, throw, catch, ride bikes, climb and much more. Years 1-6 have P.E lessons either on the field, in the hall or in our MUGA (Multi-use games area). We try to attend many sporting events throughout the year such as cross-country championships, football leagues, netball tournaments, benchball competitions and more!

Safeguarding Safety Tip of the Week

It is common for children to feel nervous about going back to school after Christmas. To help calm their nerves and make sure they're prepared for the school term make sure:

- Bedtimes are adjusted to get back into a healthy routine
- Children are not taking any devices like mobile phones or tablets to bed with
- them that will stop them from sleeping
 - They eat breakfast every morning.

Talk to your children about their day at School. It is important that they can talk to you if they are worried about anything.

Free School Meals

Why should I apply?

For every child that is entitled to free school meals the school receives extra funding to enhance provision and improve progress and outcomes for children. So please apply even if you do not wish to take up your free school meal.

What are the qualifying criteria for Free School Meals?

Your child might be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- · income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- · the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)


