

Headteacher's Message...

Date - 26.01.2024

Dear Families.

We would like to take a moment to remind you about the importance of road safety for our children. With the hustle and bustle of daily life, it is crucial that we work together to ensure the safety of our young ones as they travel to and from school.

As you may already know, road accidents remain a significant concern in our society. It is our shared responsibility to equip our children with the knowledge and skills needed to navigate roads safely. With this in mind, we kindly request your cooperation in reinforcing the following road safety guidelines at home:

Always Use Pedestrian Crossings

Teach your child to use pedestrian crossings whenever available. Remind them to look both ways before crossing the road, making eye contact with drivers to ensure they have been seen. Encourage them to wait for the green signal or the patting man before proceeding.

Be Visible at All Times

Help your child understand the importance of being visible to drivers. Ensure they wear bright, reflective clothing, especially during darker mornings and evenings. Adding reflective accessories, such as armbands or wristbands, can greatly enhance their visibility.

Walk on the Pavement

Encourage your child to walk on the pavement wherever possible. If no pavement is available, instruct them to walk facing oncoming traffic, making sure they are aware of their surroundings. Discourage them from walking or playing too close to the edge of the road. At school please do not use the carpark to walk across. Do not allow your children to run through the carpark it is very busy at drop off and pick up times.

Bicycle Safety

If your child cycles to school, it is essential to reinforce road safety rules specific to cycling. Ensure they wear a properly fitted helmet, understand hand signals, and are aware of basic traffic rules. Encourage them to cycle in designated cycle lanes, away from heavy traffic whenever possible.

Encourage Safe Behaviour as a Pedestrian

Teach your child to behave responsibly when walking near roads. Discourage them from using mobile phones, listening to music with headphones, or engaging in any other distracting activities that remove their attention from the road environment.

Road safety requires constant vigilance, both from us as adults and from our children. By consistently reinforcing these guidelines, we can help create a safer environment for everyone. Remember, leading by example is a powerful way to instill good habits in our children.




Gates are open by 8.45am and close shortly after. Please ensure your child is on time and ready to learn.
