Dear Parents,

I am absolutely thrilled to inform you that our school has received a fantastic Ofsted report. We have been rated as "Good" in all areas, which is a truly outstanding achievement! I wanted to take this opportunity to share the exciting news with you and express my sincere gratitude for your ongoing support. The report highlights several key strengths of our school, which I believe are a direct result of the dedication and hard work shown by our wonderful children, committed staff, and supportive parents. Here are a few notable points that were mentioned:

#### **Ambitious Curriculum**

The report acknowledges that even though our published outcomes are low, this is not reflective of the quality of education in place for current pupils. The inspectors were particularly impressed with the focus on reading and it is clear that this is key element of our curriculum and we understand that this is the backbone to all learning. We have an ambitious curriculum.

#### Leadership of the School

Ofsted praised the strong leadership and management of the school. The inspectors highlighted the collaborative approach taken by the leadership team and the positive impact it has had on staff morale and children's outcomes.

#### **Pupil Attitudes**

Additionally, the report commended the positive attitudes and behaviour of our children, noting the respectful and supportive relationships they have with their teachers and peers. This is undoubtedly a reflection of the nurturing and inclusive environment that staff have all worked tirelessly to create.

#### **Support for Pupils with SEND**

Finally, the inspectors noted that pupils with SEND, in both Willow and Piper, achieve well. The report noted that teaching is adapted in a way that supports pupils to learn the curriculum successfully. Parents describe the school as 'a beacon of inclusivity and compassion'.

While we are incredibly proud of our achievements, the report also provides some valuable recommendations for further improvement. I would like to assure you that we are fully committed to addressing these areas and making continuous progress as a school community. Some of the recommendations highlighted are:

#### Improving Writing

We will focus on ensuring children's gaps in their knowledge and skills for writing will continue to improve with a real focus on accuracy and fluency.

#### **Assessment Informing Planning**

We need to continue to ensure that assessment is used to inform curriculum planning to support pupils next steps in learning. This happens in most subjects but not all.

Once again, I would like to express my sincere gratitude for your continuous support, as it has played an instrumental role in our school's success. Together, we have created an environment that allows our students to flourish academically, socially, and emotionally.

I believe this excellent Ofsted report is a testament to the dedication and commitment of our entire school community. Let us take pride in this achievement and continue to strive for excellence. #### **Vaping**

This week our focus is on vaping. Vaping isn't harmless. Despite fruity flavours and sleek designs, vaping devices deliver addictive nicotine and potentially harmful chemicals. Even "nicotine-free" vapes expose children to other unknown risks. Young brains are vulnerable and nicotine can harm brain development, impact memory and learning, and affect attention span. Evidence shows that children who vape are more likely to try cigarettes later. Talk to your child openly about vaping. Explain the risks and address any misconceptions spread by their peers or marketing. 
