Presentation Guidelines

Things to	o remember while you're working:
We take a lot of Pride in our work. When we make mistake mistakes, we correct them neatly. If things are stuck into our books, we take care to do it properly. Underlining We use a ruler to keep our lines straight.	 b remember while you're working: Handwriting: All written work should be done in your neatest writing. Capital letters and letters with tall ascenders should be clear. Letters should be formed and sized correctly, and your writing should sit on the line. If you are able to join properly, you should always join your writing. You should leave a clear, sensible space between words. You should start your writing against your margin after each line. Leave a line after each paragraph. Maths books: You should keep your work organised by putting one digit in each square. When writing ideas, you should sit your writing on the lines. Using lines: If you make a mistake, cross it out with a single line. Sticking things in: Anything stuck into your book must be stuck straight. Nothing should hang outside of the page and the corners should be glued down. Editing or correcting: To enable improved editing you should miss a line between each line of writing If you are asked to correct or edit your work after feedback, you

Spelling and punctuation: If you are copying work from books or the board, there should be no spelling mistakes. You should always take care to spell words correctly, especially common words. If you are not sure how to spell a word, sound it our carefully or use a dictionary to check spelling.




Safeguarding Safety Tip of the Week


